



Message From Pastor Scott...


When I lived up in the cold Midwest, there were years that I spent more than a few hours on my knees praying that winter and the snow would hold off. I was just following the advice of Paul when he


So rather than try to pray the snow away, *let's pray*, "Come, Lord Jesus, Come!"

In August, Spirit of Grace received an Employee Retention Credit of \$144,832, from which was paid a professional fee of \$28,966 for preparation of the applications which generated the credit. DID YOU KNOW?

ADVENT GIVING TREE - 2023




I read a devotion a few years ago that said "Advent is a time to celebrate light in the midst of darkness." The candles of Advent represent hope, preparation, joy, and love.

FINDING PEACE AFTER LOSS: New 4th Edition Spring Session Starts Thursday, January 25, 2024

If you have lost a spouse, child, family member or friend, this is a place where you can find people who understand the deep hurt you feel. You do not have to go through the grieving process alone. GriefShare is for people grieving the death of a loved one. The loss can be recent or in the past.

GriefShare is a Christ-centered small group. Each GriefShare session includes a video seminar featuring top experts on grief recovery, plus real people sharing their real stories. After each video presentation, we spend time in small groups discussing what was presented and how it applies to what is going on in our lives.

Even if you have attended GriefShare sessions in the past, join us for this new 4th Edition. It contains updated information and relevant content for today's issues.

Each session is independent. The 13-week series is free to attend, however a donation of \$20 is suggested to cover the cost of your workbook.

GIFTS OF HOPE ~ 2023

Funds for these items (and many more) are needed by our brothers and sisters in African

countries. For over 20 years, our Spirit of Grace congregation has donated funds to Gifts of Hope for faith-based healthcare, food, education, livestock, water filtration, and transportation. With grateful hearts, the recipients of your giving in Africa send their most sincere "**Thank You.**"



How did this begin? During the late 1990s, various Lutheran groups, including the ELCA, joined together in a program called "Stand with Africa – A Campaign of Hope." Spirit of Grace member Pastor Dan Olson (who had served 25 years as Africa Program Director of the ELCA) helped advance this effort to launch our congregation's "Gifts of Hope" in 2002.

What have we accomplished in over 20 years? Spirit of Grace members have donated over \$673,000 in funds to help individuals and families in Tanzania, Liberia, South Sudan, and other African nations. We only work with projects the ELCA supports. This means the projects are all vetted. Over the two decades of Gifts of Hope, children with cleft palates, orthopedic abnormalities, and burns have received surgery and rehabilitation. You have helped fund mosquito bed nets to protect from malaria; goats for milk and cheese; chickens for eggs; a tiller and seed for crops; water pumps; and food for refugees. You helped buy cancer radiation equipment - a project that has a local connection with Barrow Neurological Institute.

What are the opportunities for support this year? You can support projects related to "Healthcare," "Education," and "Nutrition." Examples include support for Kafika House (formerly The Plaster House) which provides life-changing surgeries (with pre-surgical care and post-surgical rehabilitation). Or, The Jacobson Endowed Scholarship- supporting medical training for muchneeded local Tanzanian physicians. Or, a school lunch program in Cairo providing humanitarian aid to refugee-status and displaced children. And more......


38 people to do HHD. You are all much appreciated! ~ Dorothy Carnes
