A Message From Pastor Scott...

For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. ~Jeremiah 29:11



We are a people with hope and as we enter this new year, we will do well to let our hope lead us. Hope is powerful. Years ago Kennon Callahan wrote about the most important human searches and among them is hope. He

wrote: "Hope is stronger than memory. Memory is strong. Hope is stronger. People live on hope, not on memory. Take away a person's memories, and they become anxious. Take away a person's hopes, and they become terrified" (p. 124). We can face incredible challenges when we have hope and the people of God have reason for great hope.

In the darkest days of the Babylonian siege of Jerusalem, Jeremiah was asked by God to go out and buy a piece of real estate—complete with witnesses, a deed, and money exchanged (Jer. 32:6–15). This was a sign that there was hope for the future. It may have seemed to make no sense to those who looked on, knowing that the land he was buying would fall into the hands of the enemy. But the day eventually came when these captive people would be set free and returned to their land, rebuild homes and reestablish their vineyards. Jeremiah's purchase of land was designed to provide a beacon of hope.

It is sad that so many in our world are living without hope. I certainly can fall victim to my worries about the future...about my finances, my retirement, my health, my family, my family's health...and it can go on and on. But I continue to lean onto my hope in Christ which is greater than my worries. What an amazing hope we have!

Our church is built on that hope. We stake our claim to it as we plan for our future. When we live out our mission goals and support them with our tithes, gifts and time, we live out our hope and we become a beacon of hope for others....to those who are captive to the despair and anxiety of these days. What a powerful presence that hope gives us.

I'm pretty sure we will not have a year devoid of struggles and problems. It would be nice. But whatever comes we can know and trust that Christ is our hope beyond it all. *Hope was born in Bethlehem! Hope wasn't stopped by a cruel cross! Hope lives! You can count on it.*

MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. DAY—JANUARY 24


Did you know that Martin Luther King Jr's famous, "*I Have a Dream*" speech was partially improvised and that the iconic phrase was left out of the original draft?

While King had used the line in several speeches in the



months prior to the March on Washington on August 28, 1963, a few of his advisors questioned its use and kept it out of the original drafts of the speech. While delivering his address to the nation, King was encouraged by his friend and legendary gospel singer, Mahalia Jackson to "*tell them about the dream, Martin."* King departed from 4-minute prepared remarks to deliver one of the most famous and influential speeches of the 20th century.

Gifts of Hope 2023

Until Jan 5, 2024



What do surgeries for children, goats, scholarships, & meals for refugees all have in common?

Thank you so much for the donations given thus far to Gifts of Hope!

Funds for many items are still needed by our brothers and sisters in African countries. For over 20 years, our Spirit of Grace congregation has donated funds to *Gifts of Hope* for faith-based healthcare, food, education, livestock, water filtration, and transportation. With grateful hearts, the recipients of your giving in Africa send their most sincere "Thank You."

How did this begin?

During the late 1990s, various Lutheran groups, including the ELCA, joined together in a program called "Stand with Africa – A Campaign of Hope." Spirit of Grace member Pastor Dan Olson (who had served 25 years as Africa Program Director of the ELCA) helped advance this effort to launch our congregation's "*Gifts of Hope*" in 2002.

What have we accomplished in over 20 years?

Spirit of Grace members have donated over \$673,000 in funds to help individuals and families in Tanzania, Liberia, South Sudan, and other African nations. We only work with projects the ELCA supports. This means the projects are all vetted.

Over the two decades of Gifts of Hope, children with cleft palates, orthopedic abnormalities, and burns have received surgery and rehabilitation. You have helped fund mosquito bed nets to protect from malaria; goats for milk and cheese; chickens for eggs; a tiller and seed for crops; water pumps; and food for refugees. You helped buy cancer radiation equipment - a project that has a local connection with Barrow Neurological Institute.

What are the opportunities for support this year?

You can support projects related to "Healthcare," "Education," and "Nutrition." Examples include support for Kafika House (formerly The Plaster House) which provides life-changing surgeries (with pre-surgical care and post-surgical rehabilitation). Or, The Jacobson Endowed Scholarship--supporting medical training for much-needed local Tanzanian physicians. Or, a school lunch program in Cairo providing humanitarian aid to refugee-status and displaced children. And more......


If you are tired of just going through the motions of Christianity and want to mine the depths of what it really means to live deeply in Christ, you'll find


We also have people who accept donations at our drive-up door and those who go out on our truck to pick up donations. As you can see, it's volunteers and donations that make this place successful.
