




It is a powerful thing to invite people to church. Without an invitation few will just walk through the doors to join us. An invitation is a loving and caring action that moves people to do something new.




the book of Revelation with Rev. Dr. Peter S. Perry on March 13 and 20 here at Spirit of Grace!

Resistant Hope: Fighting Back Against Suffering*

March 6th — 10:00: Rev. Elaine Siemsen

Foundation: When suffering occurs in our own experience or that of another, the first question is often, "Where is God? Or Why did God let this happen?"

The question of suffering is called Theodicy or "Where is God in times of Suffering."

I learned that there have been four traditional answers which cause us to choose between an all powerful/all knowing God or a compassionate one or lead to the logical conclusion that God has no power in our world or in our lives.

***You are invited to join in the final discussion even if you missed the first two! ***

February 21, we discussed a definition of suffering and the question of where is God in times of suffering.

February 28, We thought about the different possible answers.

March 6, we will talk about a proposal for responding to suffering that allows God's compassion and love to shine through all of us even in the most painful situations.



EASTER CANDY FUN FACTS






BLOOD PRESSURE CHECKS

Faith Community Nurse Corner: What's Going On...??

Many of you watched the Super Bowl game February 11th between the San Francisco 49ers and the Kansas City Chiefs. It was an exciting game that went into overtime, with the Kansas City Chiefs winning the coveted trophy. Thankfully, the game was played

without life threatening injuries.

In contrast, how many of you remember January 2, 2023; Monday Night football, the Buffalo Bills / Cincinnati Bengals. Buffalo Bills player, Damar Hamlin suffered a hit to his chest causing his heart to stop. (Cardiac Arrest). Thanks to the training of the staff and equipment that was immediately available, he survived and made a full recovery. He returned to playing football nine months following his injury. While this event was watched live on TV by millions of people when it happened, and received much media coverage, about 350,000 Cardiac Arrests happen each year – 70% of those happen at home.

When a person has a cardiac arrest, survival depends on immediately receiving CPR from someone nearby. *Help your family, and community by learning 2 simple steps of Hands-Only CPR:*

Call 911

Begin CPR. Press hard and fast in the center of the chest.

These two basic steps can save a life. You are buying time until emergency personnel arrive to administer advanced life support and transport to the hospital. In addition, use of the AED (automated external defibrillator), if one is available, is an extra link in the Chain of Survival.

911, CPR, AED, Emergency Personnel, Hospital = Chain of Survival.

At Spirit of Grace, we have a group of individuals trained in CPR/AED. If you are interested in this life saving training, please contact me to schedule a class. You can help save a life.

More than 650 million American women are living with some form of heart disease, yet only half are aware that heart disease is the number one killer of women. 
Dear Lord,

JESUS PREDICTS HIS DEATH A THIRD TIME...


Now Jesus was going up to Jerusalem. On the way, he took the Twelve aside and said to them, "We are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be delivered over to the chief priests

and the teachers of the law. They will condemn him to death and will hand him over to the Gentiles to be mocked and flogged and crucified.

On the third day he will be raised to life!" ~ MATTHEW 20:18-19








Among the 16 women profiled in The Women of the Bible Speak by Shannon Bream, we meet Deborah, a judge during the years when the Israelites 'had done evil in the eyes of Lord and were cruelly oppressed by their enemies." At God's direction, she commanded her general to assemble an army from among the peasantry and defeat the formidable forces of the Canaanites, but he agrees only if she goes with him. Her confidence in God's promise of victory is fulfilled and there is peace for 40 years.

Wild West Women: Fifty Lives That Shaped the Frontier, edited by Erin H.

Turner, includes Lozen, an Arizona Apache woman who played a similar role to Deborah's among her people. A warrior, scout and medicine woman, she rode with Geronimo, Cochise and Vittorio, who said of her, "Strong as a man, braver than most, and cunning in strategy, Lozen is a shield to her people." The last free Apaches would have been captured much earlier except for her "supernatural" ability to locate the enemy.





The Woman They Could Not Silence by Kate Moore is the story of Elizabeth Packard, a mother of six, who was wrongfully committed to an insane asylum in 1860 by her minister husband because she questioned his religious views. Locked up for three years under inhumane conditions, she prayed that God would grant her the strength to resist. When a smuggled note secured her a public hearing, she was declared "sane", but her husband left her penniless and homeless. Amazingly, she reinvented herself, became an advocate for women's rights and better insanity laws.

Her best-selling books and success in changing the laws allowed her to reclaim her children, but questions about her sanity persisted. Finally, in 2023, the mental health center, named for the doctor who had kept her imprisoned, was changed to the Elizabeth Packard Mental Health Center in her honor.

The Women is Kristen Hannah's tribute to the 11,000 women, mostly nurses, who served in the U.S. military during the Vietnam War. Frankie McGrath impetuously volunteers after her brother is killed in the war and his friend tells her, "Women can **be heroes, too.** "She exchanges her sheltered life for one of chaos and destruction where life is a gamble, friendships run deep and can be shattered in an instant. But the real battle is coming home to a divided America that wants to forget the war and those who fought it.

We will also learn about Katie's Fund, our outreach project, prior to our offering.


